PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to seek Council's decision on who to support for Representative Members of the Spencer Gulf Cities to the South Australian Regional Organisations of Council (SAROC).

BACKGROUND

The new SAROC Terms of Reference includes provisions for the calling of nominations for two (2) members of SAROC from each region by no later than 3 months prior to the LGA AGM before the officers are due to retire.

On 20 August 2018 the Local Government Association of SA wrote to Councils calling for nominations for the two (2) positions on the South Australian Regional Organisation of Councils (SAROC) representing the Spencer Gulf Cities (SGC).

DISCUSSION

Three nominations for the two positions were received from the following candidates (as per order on ballot paper):

- 1) Mayor John Rohde (Port Pirie Regional Council)
- 2) Mayor Sam Johnson (Port Augusta City Council)
- 3) Mayor Lyn Breuer (Whyalla City Council)

As a result of receiving more than the required number of nominations, in accordance with Clause 4.4.4 of the SAROC Terms of Reference, an election for the two positions on SAROC representing Spencer Gulf Cities will take place.

Council now has an opportunity to consider the three nominations and to cast a vote for those two nominees which Council would like to support for the two positions.

Details of each candidate's profile are attached for Members' consideration.

Ballot papers must be received by the Returning Officer by 5:00pm on Thursday 18 October 2018. The counting of votes will take place at Local Government House on Friday 19 October 2018 commencing at 9:00am. The successful candidates will be the candidates receiving the most votes, that is the "first past the post".

The successful candidate will take office from the conclusion of the LGA's 2018 Annual General Meeting for a term ending at the conclusion of the 2020 LGA Annual General Meeting.

It is considered that pursuant to Section 90(3)(g) of the *Local Government Act 1999*, the information to be received, discussed or considered in relation to this agenda item is information concerning matters that must be considered in confidence in order to ensure that the council does not breach any duty of confidence.

It is considered necessary to discuss this report in confidence and that the principle that the meeting be conducted in a place open to the public has been outweighed in the circumstances because the nominations need to be discussed, two selections made and the confidential ballot papers returned to the LGA of SA for the count to be undertaken.
