

### **Aboriginal Heritage**

Port Augusta's title as the Crossroads of Australia is as relevant today as it was in pre-European times when it was a central point in the lives of the Aboriginal people, featuring in the verse and stories of inland groups well into Central Australia. Apart from its religious and mythological significance to inland groups, and its position on their main trade route, the Port Augusta area had plentiful supplies of food such as kangaroos and game birds, and a chain of waterholes down through the Flinders Ranges made it readily accessible. "Curdnatta" was an Aboriginal name for the area, meaning "Sandy Place".

Barngarla and Nukunu people are the Traditional Custodians of the ancestral lands. As it has been in the past, Port Augusta continues to be a meeting place, with members of many different language groups living here.


### Malka Aboriginal Art Prize

Malka, meaning 'mark' or 'painting' is a word used by a number of regional Aboriginal

language groups. The Malka Aboriginal Art Prize, which includes a significant art exhibition, is held in June/July each year and coincides with NAIDOC Week.













### **History of Port Augusta**

### **Early Exploration**

In 1802 Captain Matthew Flinders navigated and named Spencer Gulf in The Investigator and examined the head of the gulf in a cutter, hoping to find a waterway to the interior. While Matthew Flinders' expedition found traces of Aboriginal habitation, they did not encounter any Aboriginal people. The following year a French expedition under Captain L. Freycinet on Le Casuarina also explored the gulf but did not land. Other early recorded visits included the cutter Dart, searching for Captain Sturt's exploration party in 1830. Edward John Eyre passed through the district several times in 1839/40, and obtained supplies brought by the cutter Water Witch under Captain Germain. Charles Christian Dutton and John Ainsworth Horrocks also explored the district, as settlers began to farm the fertile country north of Mt Remarkable in the 1840s. The first pastoral leases were granted in 1851.

### The Naming of Port Augusta

On the 24th of May, 1852, Port Augusta was named by A.L. Elder after Augusta Sophia Marryat, who, at the age of 22, married Sir Henry Edward Fox Young, the first civilian Governor of South Australia. The couple left England just two weeks after their wedding. Lady Augusta was the daughter of Charles Marryat, and a niece of Captain Marryat R.N., a well known author. Another uncle was Right Rev. Augustus Short, the first Bishop of Adelaide, who laid the foundation stone of St Augustine's Anglican Church in Port Augusta on July 13th 1868. A son and a daughter were born to Lady Augusta and Sir Henry whilst in Government House. Lady Augusta Fox Young passed away in England on the 18th of January, 1913.


### **Port Augusta's Water Supply**

In the early years of settlement Port Augusta had no reliable drinking water. Water was sourced from a creek on Paterson Station, below Mount Brown, and brought to Port Augusta in casks on drays. This changed in 1865 when a pipeline was laid from Woolundunga Springs in the Flinders Ranges into Port Augusta. In 1944 Port Augusta's water supply was secured with the laying of the Morgan-Whyalla pipeline, supplying Port Augusta with water from the Murray River which assisted in the growth of the City.

Don't miss this unique (and free) garden experience while in Port Augusta. Set on the shores of Spencer Gulf with spectacular views to the ancient Flinders Ranges, the Australian Arid Lands Botanic Garden showcases a variety of arid zone habitats in a picturesque location, set on more than 200 hectares of land.

Enjoy one of Australia's most significant collections of the desert-loving Eremophila, then stroll through the innovative and award-winning AridSmart Display Gardens where you'll discover how Australia's beautiful arid zone flora can be used to create stunning water-wise gardens at home.

Explore the garden on one of the garden's four walking trails including a children's animal discovery path, and enjoy the diverse range of plants that grow in the Great Victoria Desert, Flinders Ranges, Gawler Ranges, West Coast and other low rainfall areas of Australia. With more than 150 species of native birds in the garden, two specially built bird hides provide an ideal viewing platform to see these and the many other native animals that call the Garden home, including the sleepy lizard (shingleback) and bearded dragon.

Children love the Arid Explorers Garden, a fully fenced garden close to the visitor centre in which they can explore, imagine and create in a beautifully designed natural play space. The area includes a 'big red' sandpit, explorer's walk, climbing logs, arid land plants selected for colour, smell and texture, massive tree trunks, a dry creek bed with bridge crossings and ample seating.

### RSL Sub-Branch Military Memorabilia Museum

Experience a Leopard Tank and the M2A2 105mm Howitzer up close at the Port Augusta RSL. The Tank was built in 1978 and was used by the Australian Army but never fired a shot in anger. It was decommissioned in 2006.

The tank can be viewed at anytime, but it is recommended to time it in with a visit to the RSL Military Museum. The Museum boasts the largest display of war memorabilia of its type in regional SA. From the Boer War, through both World Wars and to Australia's most recent conflicts, the museum showcases photos, memorabilia and artifacts donated, or on permanent loan from Port Augusta families.

## Matthew Flinders/Redcliff

Enjoy a short walk to the Memorial Cairn, dedicated to Matthew Flinders, where he stood in 1802 and named Mt Brown, Mt Arden, Point Lowly and Curlew Point in the Flinders Ranges. The newly developed area provides excellent views of the Flinders Ranges and the top of Spencer Gulf where explorers rowed in search of the inland sea.



### Day Trip 1

Travel via Stirling North, previously known as Minchin Wells. Its underground water supply sustained important market gardens that thrived on the rich Saltia alluvial plains. When the bullock trains ended in 1912, the nearby settlements at Saltia and Pichi Richi disappeared but Stirling North survived to become an industrial centre for the railways in the 1950's. It is now a residential area with good accommodation.

Visit the art galleries, Agricultural Museum & Powell Gardens at Quorn.

Drive along the Yarrah Vale Gorge Road to the Dutchman's Stern Conservation Park, Warren Gorge, Mount Arden, Proby's Grave, Buckaringa Scenic Drive and Lookout. Inspect the Simmonston Ruins and then travel back to Port Augusta via Quorn (approx. 3hrs drive).

### Day Trip 2

Travel via Stirling North, Quorn towards Hawker. Visit Death Rock, Kanyaka & Wilson Historical Sites and Arkaroo Rock. Jeff Morgan's Gallery at Hawker is a must see. The Flinders Ranges National Park, Wilpena Pound and Rawnsley Park offer a wide range of experiences. Check out the geological aspects of the many gorges or detour

and go underground at the Blinman Mine. Try one of the many 4WD tracks on private property. Brochures available from Wadlata (full day).

### Day Trip 3

From Quorn travel along Richmond Valley Road to Devil's Peak & Trail (in season), Mawson Trail – Cycling, Mt Brown Conservation Park, Waukarie Falls & Creek Walking Trail. Great picnic spots or serious or relaxed bush walks can be experienced (approx. 4hrs drive).

### Day Trip 4

Visit Hancocks Lookout, the Puppet and Toy Museum at Wilmington, and Alligator Gorge in the Mount Remarkable National Park. The Courthouse Heritage Centre and the Nukunu Peoples Interpretive Centre at Melrose is a must. The Flinders Ranges have great wineries and are all worth a visit, as is the Steam & Traction Preservation Society Museum at Booleroo Centre. Head towards Stone Hut and be sure to call into the Bakery. Return to Port Augusta via Blesing Gardens Cellar Door along the old Survey Road or the Bridle 4WD Track then take a walk along the Port Germein Jetty. Check opening times for the wineries (full day).

#### Alternative return route via Peterborough:

From Stone Hut, travel to Peterborough via Jamestown. Take a guided tour of the Steamtown Heritage Rail Centre. The Sound and Light Show in the evening is a must do. You must experience the phenomena of Magnetic Hill at Orroroo. Everyone will love this! Only a 1.5 hour trip back to Port Augusta from Peterborough (134km).







### Fishing in and Around Port Augusta

Spencer Gulf is a unique marine environment, which receives very little fresh water flushing from the land. The region has narrowing tidal channels with huge intertidal flats, low winter water temperatures of 8°C to a high 28°C in summer. It has strong day tides during summer and strong night tides during winter, plus minimal tidal movement for up to 3-4 days during the tide cycles. In blocks of 6-8 weeks fish species migrate north and south depending on their preferred temperature range.

### **Fishing Regulations**

There are State wide regulations (Fisheries Act 1982), for South Australia that all anglers should be aware of. A total netting ban exists from Port Augusta to half way to Whyalla. This excludes crab and dab nets.

NOTE: Phone 1800 065 522 or www.pir.sa.gov.au to obtain the current fishing regulations especially restrictions associated with the Marine Parks and the shipping channel in the upper Spencer Gulf area and other man made reefs.
